## **Product Description**

Appearance: White to white with a yellow cast powder

Ouabain, a cardiac glycoside, is derived from the seeds of *Strophanthus gratus*. It is a classical Na<sup>+</sup>-K<sup>+</sup> pump inhibitor. Ouabain inhibits Na<sup>+</sup>, K<sup>+</sup>-ATPase, thus blocking the active efflux of Na<sup>+</sup>, reuptake of K<sup>+</sup>, and repolarization of neurons and muscle cells.<sup>6</sup> It has been reported that at least 80-100 mM of ouabain required for maximum inhibition and approximately 20 mM for half-maximum inhibition of ATP hydrolysis.<sup>7</sup>

Ouabain binding has been used as a marker in studies of the regulation of Na<sup>+</sup>,K<sup>+</sup>-ATPase levels in brain by adrenergic<sup>8</sup> and other neurotransmitter systems. Since ouabain reduces the transmembrane sodium gradient and releases monoamine neurotransmitters from neurons, it has been used to study the effect of acute and chronic administration of pharmacological agents on the metabolism and release of monoamine neurotransmitters.<sup>9</sup>

Ouabian is also used in tissue culture as a selective agent in the production of hybrid cells. The recommended working concentration is 10  $\mu$ M.  $^{10,11,12}$ 

## **Preparation Instructions**

Sigma tests the solubility of ouabain in hot water. At 50 mg/mL a clear colorless to slightly hazy faint yellow solution is obtained. It is also soluble in 1 in 100 parts of ethanol and 1 in 30 parts of methanol. It is practically insoluble in chloroform and ether.<sup>4</sup>

## Storage/Stability

Ouabain is recommended to be stored at room temperature and protected from light. Based on lots reassayed, if properly stored, it will have a shelf-life of up to 5 years.

Ouabain solutions should be protected from light and may be sterilized by autoclaving and filtration. <sup>5</sup>
